Experiential

Sometimes activities help us to understand and process biblical truths. The below are suggestions for how to experience the truths of 1st John 2: 15-29. Feel free to use them or any you might come up with.

Explain the object

Materials needed: blindfolds

Put a blindfold on a person. Another person who isn't blindfolded gives them instructions to help them accomplish a task. Choose whatever task you like ... pouring a cup of water or coffee, setting the table, putting away a toy, maneuvering around a room without hitting anything, etc.

The point: it's one thing to hear the commands, it's another thing to hear and do them. With a blind fold, we are forced to depend on the one who sees clearly. How well do we listen to the One who truly sees clearly when we aren't blindfolded?

What is the point: This drives home the value of seeing, hearing and experiencing. We can proclaim with more passion and authenticity that which we experience first-hand.

PRAY
