MEMORIZE – Jonah 2:8

READ Jonah 3: 1-10

Questions to ponder/discuss:

1. What is this passage revealing about God and what is it revealing about us as humans?
2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life? What will that look like?

4. In 3:6 we see the king’s response. He arises from his throne, takes off his robe, dresses in sackcloth and sits in ashes. What is the significance of each of these responses?
5. The bible is full of examples where God’s servants mess up and need his forgiveness. In addition to Jonah, we have Abraham, Jacob, Moses, Peter, to name a few. In light of this forgiveness, read Psalm 130. According to this Psalm, what is the point of the LORD’s forgiveness? (hint: verse 4)

Experiential

“Daily Reminder”

In chapter 3, Jonah did “according to the word of the LORD.” If we are honest, we often fail to follow the word of the LORD in our daily lives. Here’s an activity to help us overcome this. Find a bible verse that you find important and want to live out intentionally in your life. For example (and a good choice as well) would be Acts 2:8. The activity is to write this verse (or whichever one you pick) on a post-card or make a poster and then put it somewhere you look every day. Maybe write it on your bathroom mirror, write it on a post card and then put it on your dashboard. The important thing is you pick a verse, write it and place it in a prominent spot. Every time you see it, read it and ask the Holy Spirit to make it a rhythm of your life.
