

# Dig Deeper @Home – "Songs of Advent"

## Complement to sermon on December 31, 2017 – Living with an Advent Urgency

## MEMORIZE – Revelation 21: 3-4

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither will there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

## **READ Revelation 22:6-21**

#### **Questions to ponder/discuss:**

- 1. What is this passage revealing about God and what is it revealing about us as humans?
- 2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life? What will that look like?
- 3. In these verses, the phrase,"Behold, I am coming soon" is repeated three times. (verses 7,12,20) and it is also repeated in 2:16 and 3:11. We can never miss the note of urgency and warning in all what Jesus tells us about His coming. Read Matthew 24:42-44. What does Jesus say we are to do to prepare for His coming?
- In verse 10 it says, "Do not seal up the words of this prophecy of this book, for the time is near." How is this command in contrast to Old Testament prophecy found in Daniel 8:26? The phrase, "the words of prophecy of this book" is repeated several times in this passage. (vss. 7,9,10,18,19)

Read each verse and describe what it says we are to do in relation to these words.

- 5. In verse 17, the word "come" is used three times. How does this speak to the good news of the gospel of redemption? What is the cost to the one who receives this water? (cf. Isaiah 55:1-2)
- 6. In verse 12, He says, "My reward is with me, and I will give to everyone according to what he has done." Does this mean that we are saved by our works? (cf. James 2:20, Titus 3:5-8) How are we to live according to verse 14? Contrast that with the lifestyle indicated in vs. 15

## **EXPERIENTIAL**

Sometimes activities help us to understand and process biblical truths. The one below is a suggestion for how to experience the truths of Revelation 22:6-21

**Waiting Game**- (If you have children or grandchildren, have the family gather around the table) Ahead of time prepare to have a special treat for dessert or special snack. As the children arrive at the table, tell them you have a special surprise for them, but it's not here yet. Keep building up the surprise for at least five minutes as the children wait. Finally, have someone bring in the special treat. Then ask: How did you feel as you waited? Was it easy or difficult to wait? Explain. Was the wait worth it? Why or why not? Refer to Revelation 21-22 when Jesus returns. How exciting a time that will be and how important it is that we are ready and waiting for this great return.
