

**Dig Deeper @Home – “With Everything
Complement to sermon on January 14, 2018 – “Who to Worship?”**

MEMORIZE – Psalm 145:1-2

I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you and praise your name forever and ever.

READ Psalm 146

Questions to ponder/discuss:

1. What does Psalm 146 reveal about God?

2. What does Psalm 146 reveal about humans?

3. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life? What will that look like?

4. Read Matthew 4: 1-11. In this section we get a glimpse into the temptation of Jesus.
 - a. In verse 8-9, what does the devil do, what does he promise Jesus and what does he want from Jesus?

 - b. Jesus responds by quoting Deuteronomy 6:13 to worship God alone. What things in your life do you need to respond to by quoting Deut 6:13?

 - c. Now go back and read Deuteronomy 6: 6-15. What is the warning in verses 10-15. What gods in our land desire our worship? What gods have you been worshipping? What will it take to turn from that worship?

Summarize the book of Psalm 146 sentences or less

Experiential

Sometimes activities help us to understand and process biblical truths. The one below is a suggestion for how to experience the truths of the book of Psalm 146. Feel free to use one of these or any you might come up with.

Character of God

Psalm 146 speaks of many of God's characteristics and how He acts. Take time to write your own Psalm 146 thinking about the ways you personally have experienced God. Commit to share this with 1 or 2 other people this week. If in a family or small group, take time sharing your Psalms and make it a time of celebration.
