



Dig Deeper @Home – “With Everything”

Complement to sermon on February 11, 2018 – “How to Worship?”

MEMORIZE – Psalm 145:1-2

I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you and praise your name forever and ever.

READ Psalms 147 & 149

Questions to ponder/discuss:

1. What does Psalm 147/149 reveal about God? About Humanity?
2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life?
3. According to Psalm 147:11 God takes pleasure in those who fear him and trust in His steadfast love. What does this mean? What does this look like?
4. Psalm 147:10 says what God does not delight in. What are these things? Why do you think the Psalmist includes what He does not delight in this poem? Compare/contrast this with what we as people often delight in.
5. How does Psalm 149 encourage us to give praise to God? In what ways do you give praise to God throughout the week? What are some methods of praise you could add to your worship this week? What keeps you from expressing your praise in all the ways listed in Psalm 149? What would it take to overcome these?

Summarize the Psalm 147 and Psalm 149 each in two sentences or less

Experiential

Worship at Home
